SigEp is Weathering the Financial Storm Thanks to Careful Financial Management & Alumni Support

Thanks to prudent financial management and generous support from dozens of Ohio Eta alumni, parents, actives and friends, Sigma Phi Epsilon is weathering the economic crisis impacting most Americans.

The Ohio Eta Alumni Board has taken extraordinary measures to preserve the chapter house and the investment made by so many donors and supporters. In the summer of 2008, the original 5-year balloon mortgage was renegotiated with Eaton National Bank and a new mortgage was signed at a rate of 6.92% for the next five years.

To continue to weather the storm and secure the fraternity's financial future, alumni are asked to buy an engraved brick to be placed at the chapter house. The funds raised from the brick campaign are used to reduce the mortgage on the chapter house allowing the AVC to continue making permanent capital improvements with operating funds and upgrades and to ensure continued financial strength.

"Our goal is to leave future SigEps debt-free," said Alumni Board President **Graham Mitchell '73.** "Alumni can help reduce the chapter's debt and pay down the mortgage by purchasing a brick in the *Leave Your Legacy* campaign."

Full of amenities for the twenty-first century college student, the new SigEp house came with a hefty price tag - more than \$1.5 million.

Since the house opened, the alumni board has invested additional money into the facility, put away nearly \$250,000 in an emergency reserve fund and paid more than \$390,000 on the mortgage.

Thanks to careful management, the original mortgage of nearly \$1.2 million has been reduced to \$802,440.

"Our goal, right now, is to continue to reduce the overall debt, decrease operating expenses and ensure longterm viability," explained Mitchell. "In the process, we also hope to beautify the grounds of the house and recognize our alumni supporters with an engraved brick bearing their name or the name of a loved one they choose."

Alumni have responded to this call for support once again by generously pledging \$81,050.

Individuals, families or groups can purchase a brick for \$10,000, \$5,000, \$3,000 and \$1,200. In most cases, donors can spread their payments out over one to five years. Donors can permanently leave their mark on the SigEp house by having a classic 4" x 8" or 8" x 8" brick paver engraved with their name or the names of several brothers. Engraved bricks will fill the "Garden of Bricks" outside of the chapter house.

Alumni and friends can learn more about the program and purchase a brick online by visiting *www.ohioeta.com* and clicking on the Alumni links or by completing and returning the form on the next page.

When SigEp is ready to order the bricks later this year, members of the Alumni Board will contact donors to finalize their brick inscription information.

"We've already raised more than \$81,000 toward our \$200,000 goal," said "If you buy our \$1,200 brick, you can pay just \$50 a month over the two-year pledge period," said brick campaign chairman Jim "Sarge" Wilson '58. You can write us a check or tell us to charge your credit card each month. We'll accommodate your situation. I think most brothers can afford \$50 a month. And, that small gift will have a big impact on the fraternity."

Campaign Giving & Recognition Levels

New bedrooms, the fitness room, the back patio and other public spaces are available for naming. Naming opportunities provide a wonderful opportunity to remember a family member or fellow fraternity brother.

Under an innovative grant program developed by the Sigma Phi Epsilon National Headquarters, Ohio Eta may qualify for a \$12,000 grand to cover the costs spent remodeling the room for the Resident Scholar, a live-in advisor at the chapter house. In addition as much as \$7,000 may be available to help pay for furniture in the study room and other

educational areas of the chapter house, known as a Residential Learning Center.

In the coming week Mark Durket '76 and Graham Mitchell '73 will work with Ryan McCavitt and Scott Thompson at the Sigma Phi Epsilon Headquarters to complete the necessary grant applications to apply for these funds.
