Two Ohio Eta Brothers Honored by Miami, **Inducted into the Cradle of Coaches Association**

For Miami alumni, the university's nickname of "The Cradle of Coaches" is nothing new. What you may not know is that an official Cradle of Coaches Association was established in 1971. While all Miami Alumni who go on to coach, or those who have coached at Miami, are considered a part of the Cradle of Coaches, the Cradle of Coaches Association began inducting individuals into the Association in 1992 to further recognize their accomplishments. In February of this year, two Ohio Eta alumni were inducted into this esteemed association. Gary Quisno '76 and Rob Patrick '83 joined the honoree list that already included Woody Hayes and Bo Schembeckler, among many other outstanding coaches.

Gary Quisno '76 amassed a 253-95 career record in 33 years as a head football coach at Danbury, Oak Harbor and Perkins high schools. His teams won or shared eleven

conference titles, qualified for the state playoffs nine times and made two state semifinal appearances (1999 and 2006) in his tenure. He also produced three players who won Most Outstanding Performer in the Sandusky Bay Conference. Ouisno was named the Associate Press Division III State Coach of the Year in 2002. Northwest Ohio District Coach of the Year four times (1991, 1995, 2002, 2006) and was twice

The Ohio Eta Chapter had a busy fall of 2010! With a strong returning group of over 90 men, Sig Ep remains one of the top three largest chapters at Miami. The Greek system at Miami has undergone some major changes for the 2010-2011 school year, after some poor press last spring. The university administration passed a new set of strict social regulations the day before fall classes started. The regulations limit social activity by chapters and impose strict punishments on chapters that do not comply. Fortunately, the leadership of Ohio Eta has not had an issue conforming to the new guidelines. In fact, while many chapters are having difficulties, Ohio Eta is excelling to new heights!

Sig Ep has a record number of members serving as leaders in on-campus organizations and club-sports teams. The Division I intramural football team had a record-setting perfect season (15-0) and placed second overall in Greek Week, only eight points behind the winner.

Ohio Eta is stronger than ever. The annual Balanced Man Scholarship

had a record number of applicants and Coach Enrico Blasi of the #1 ranked NCAA Hockey team gave an inspiring speech at the BMS awards dinner.

The success of Ohio Eta is due largely to the dedicated support of all alumni. With their continued support, Sig Ep brothers will be the best leaders, scholars, athletes, and gentlemen at Miami University.

Ohio Eta Dominates Greek Week in Multiple Events!

In an exciting game, the volleyball team came from behind to take title during the final matches against Beta Theta Pi.

IFC Enforces New Rush Format for Winter 2011

The Inter Fraternity Council (IFC) voted on the new changes to the Rush format during the fall semester of 2010. IFC intends for the changes to allow smaller fraternities to gain more exposure and to give rushees a more well-rounded view of the Greek community at Miami. For this upcoming winter, Rush will have a slightly different arrangement. Instead of the traditional three-day rush cycle, this year's event will take place over four days.

The first two days of Rush will be an open format in which every student rushing has to go to four different fraternities. The third and fourth days of Rush will be similar to how it has worked in the past where students can choose to go to any house they like. The main difference is that between the second and third days of Rush, fraternities will be able to submit preferences on which students they would like to come back.

chosen to coach in the North - South All-Star Game, including the year 2000 when he was the head coach of the winning North Team led by Ben Roethlisberger. Quisno was a walk-on three-year letter winner in football at Miami from 1973-75, helping the Red and White to three consecutive Tangerine Bowl titles.

Rob Patrick '83 has been the head volleyball coach at the University of Tennessee for 14 seasons. He has twice been named national coach of the year; once- by CVU.com in 2004 and the second time by VBall Magazine in 2005. He has led the Lady Vols to NCAA Tournament berths in six of the last seven years, including a run to the Final Four in 2005. Patrick owns a 292-150 record at the helm of the Tennessee program, becoming its all-time winningest coach in October 2008. Under Patrick's guidance, 10 different student-athletes have been named All-Americans on a total of 17 occasions. He is a two-time SEC Coach of the Year recipient, earning the honor in 2004 and 2008, while earning American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) South Region Coach of the Year honors those same years. Additionally, Patrick has

served as president of the AVCA since 2009. Prior to his stint at Tennessee, Patrick served as an assistant coach at Stanford from 1994-96, helping the Cardinals to two national titles and a 92-6 mark. He served as the Director of Youth Development and Programs for USA Volleyball in 2006 and served as a highly successful club coach from 1987-96. In addition to playing club volleyball at Miami, twice serving as president, Patrick was also a member of the Miami football team.

A New Look for the SigEp Chapter Basement
