Letter to Alumni

The past year was a defining time for Ohio Eta. Undergraduate brothers responded well to a re-energized resurgence of Sigma Phi Epsilon's values and principles. A coordinated effort from chapter leadership, alumni and national advisors gave new life to Ohio Eta, a chapter struggling to attain a high level of success others expect from Miami.

Many of you read or heard about the challenges facing Greek life in Oxford. Unfortunately, Ohio Eta also had a taste of unfortunate situations. Based on concerns primarily related to student safety, the university made efforts to end this trend.

The chapter performed well in some areas and made progress with key initiatives; however, there were indications Ohio Eta did not operate as it should and engaged in activities which resulted in university action. Ultimately, the challenges facing the chapter were not grave enough to warrant closure, although the university placed the chapter on probation and revoked permission to house sophomore members in the offcampus fraternity house.

Ohio Eta remained vigilant and took responsibility for these shortcomings. With help from alumni volunteers, Sigma Phi Epsilon National Headquarters and Miami University's Cliff Alexander Greek office, Ohio Eta embarked on a quest to re-infuse the Balanced Man philosophy and position the chapter for success. The environment and culture at Miami and in Oxford remain challenging, but the future of the chapter remains where it always has, in the hands of chapter leadership and brothers of Ohio Eta.

As an alumni brother and on behalf of the Volunteer Corporation (AVC), we are focusing on three main avenues of support and structure: the Leadership Development Council (LDC), the Housing Committee and Alumni Relations.

The LDC, headed by **Bill Greer '81** and **Dave Chittock '80**, organizes opportunities and meetings with the chapter in Oxford and focuses on activities that incorporate living our values and values-based leadership development opportunities. These efforts improve the chapter and support the Balanced Man Program, which is particularly important in the current environment.

The focus of the Housing Committee is on improved operations and management of the house due to the challenging environment and housing culture in Oxford. The committee involves resources from Sigma Phi Epsilon National Housing as well as begins discussions and provides creative and innovative ideas with Miami's Greek Affairs and Student Affairs offices.

Alumni Relations continues to organize alumni events, engage alumni in various capacities and stay up-to-date on what is happening with the undergraduate chapter. Chapter Hosts Successful Balanced Man Scholarship Banquet

The 54th Grand Chapter Conclave held August 12-16 in Nashville, Tennessee, made history as SigEp became the first fraternity to abolish the pledging process, replacing it with the Balanced Man Program (BMP). In response to recent events, Ohio Eta saw an opportunity to create positive change for Greek life at Miami University. The chapter formed a comprehensive risk management plan based on the BMP. The chapter centers the program's philosophy on continuous development and single-

tiered membership. The BMP is what distinguishes Sigma Phi Epsilon from other fraternities and is now the highest priority of Ohio Eta.

Scholarships are one of the main values expressed by the BMP and to show their dedication and commitment to this

program, the chapter hosted a scholarship banquet at the Shriver Center ballroom. The chapter awarded two scholarships to Miami freshmen who exhibited alignment with Sigma Phi Epsilon's fraternal values. Head Men's Hockey Coach, Enrico Blasi, was the keynote speaker. In addition, **Chapter Faculty Advisor** Rocco Manzo, Alex Bracken '16 and Ryland Puzzitiello '17 shared remarks with attendees. Bracken stated he was pleased with the turnout at the event and excited about the future of these young leaders.

Sam Becker '17 Encourages Others to 'Live Without Fear'

Brother Sam Becker '17, like 800,000 children and adults in America, has cerebral palsy. The neurological disorder permanently affects body movement and muscle coordination. In the fall of 2015, Sam received an opportunity he could not pass up: a semester abroad in Europe. With this invitation, Sam saw something far greater than just a trip. He decided to document his experience to encourage others with the disorder to live without fear or discouragement.

Sam created a Kickstarter Campaign coined, "Pave Your Path Project." On the campaign home page, he shared his experience with cerebral palsy and the inspiration he gained seeing children living with the disease in doctors' offices and waiting rooms. Sam explained, "In

return for their inspiration I want to pay forward that inspiration with the gift of hope." The entire Ohio Eta Chapter rallied behind him as he raised \$3,565 and shared blog posts as he trekked through countries such as Belgium, Luxembourg, Amsterdam, Rome, Paris and Slovenia.

Sam not only shared his daily and weekly adventures, but he also dedicated each post to those who shaped his life. His words offered encouragement, motivation and optimism to all readers. "My advice to you: take advantage of all life has to offer. Don't get tunnel vision on one goal, just take it all in and make the most of the experiences that may define you."

Financial Update

The chapter house showed improved occupancy for 2014-2015; however, the 2015-2016 school year will be a financial challenge as we now face a year with no brothers living in the house. In late April, the University placed the chapter on disciplinary probation for 12 months, which revoked our sophomore year exemption status for this school year.

The Board committed itself to maintaining the house, and to attempt to find other sources of revenue to minimize operating expenses where it is prudent to do so. While there are legal limitations on alternative uses for the house while brothers are not living there, the Board is investigating opportunities that fall within those constraints. For example, the Board rented our building to Beta Theta Pi's national office for four weeks over the summer to house members coming to Oxford for a national leadership program. They left the house in good shape, and we received almost \$18,000 in non-budget revenue.

The House Corporation (the Alumni Board or AVC) is current on all its financial obligations and has sufficient resources to cover the mortgage, property taxes, insurance and other expenses for more than two years.

Carlson Leadership Academy

Each year, Sigma Phi Epsilon hosts leadership events to complement the learning experience already enjoyed at colleges and universities across the nation. As explained on the national fraternity's website, The Carlson Leadership Academy (CLA) is just one of many opportunities, providing interactive officer training to over 2,600 undergraduates and volunteers each year.

Each February, the CLA occurs in conjunction with officer elections, which allows each chapter the opportunity to subject new officers and volunteers to valuable training. While there, the Academy teaches officers the skills necessary to carry out the duties required from their office and ultimately give them the tools to make their chapter's goals and visions come to life. Each officer attends meetings with training specific to their office. Training in this type of group setting gives brothers a chance to interact with officers from other chapters and share their personal experiences. These training sessions not only guide participants through their active experience in SigEp but for the workforce and beyond.



The organization exists to provide children in more than 80 countries with free surgical procedures that will help to correct facial birth deformities such as cleft lips and cleft palates.

According to his biography on the Miami University Alumni Association website, Tim planned and pioneered international medical programs in partnership with national governments and health professionals from countries including China, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Nicaragua and Myanmar. He currently works as a programs officer overseeing the strategic and programmatic activities of the organization in Vietnam and Thailand. Serving the underserved is Lu's goal, one he likely refined as an active brother of SigEp.
