Lorenzo Guidi '19 was busy this summer traveling to Europe, twice! One trip to Italy, and a second trip to Greece. He was selected as one of 24 SigEps from around the country to attend the "Tragos Quest to Greece." Prior to the Greece trip, Lorenzo studied abroad in Italy through Miami University's "Made in Italy" program, traveling to Bologna, Urbino, and other Italian cities.

Lorenzo is the former OH Eta chapter president and current Miami University IFC president. When describing Greece, he said, "It was a trip that's not only memorable, but truly life-changing. In 10 days, I was able to form relationships with 23 other strangers (SigEps from around the country), whom I now call some of my best friends. The brothers and mentors used the ancient Greek culture to show us what it truly means to be a SigEp and a person. Virtue, Diligence, and Brotherly Love were exemplified in a way that has not only changed my view of SigEp, but my view on life. Throughout the trip, we were intentional to say that we were truly on a 'quest' because we bonded together to create lifelong relationships that allow us to be better men."

Current Chapter President Mathieu Hall '20 traveled to Los Angeles in August to partake in Leadershape, a retreat conference for Greeks in many different organizations from around the country hosted by the Association of Fraternal Leadership & Values. This conference focuses on how to lead with integrity while working toward a vision grounded in values.

"I had the pleasure of representing Miami University and SigEp at Leadershape and was able to spend time reflecting on myself as a leader and ways that I could not only improve my organization, but ways to change the world through creating a vision. Leadershape is something I would recommend every chapter participate in, allowing brothers to not only find ways to become a better SigEp leader, but a better world-wide leader," said Mathieu.

Chapter Update from President Mathieu Hall '20

The Ohio Eta Chapter is currently the largest fraternity on campus at 112 members this past spring semester and 92 returning in the fall. We hosted our annual Out of the Darkness Suicide Prevention Walk on October 7, headed by previous president **Lorenzo Guidi '19**, and look forward to the Balanced Man Scholarship the Chapter hosts for Miami freshmen each fall.

As we progress through this semester, we'll be looking to implement an executive vice president who will be responsible for organizing internal Chapter operations and helping the Chapter operate smoothly. We're also looking forward to using the Chapter House as a resource for faculty fellows who may be looking to get involved and interact more closely with the Chapter.

OH Eta Chapter Home Improvements

The summer of 2018 saw many improvements to the OH Eta Chapter House. While no longer the newest fraternity house in Oxford, 224 E. Church is still regarded as one of the best fraternity houses and desirable in location — close to campus and King Library as well as a block from uptown.

In addition to aging features needing updates, SigEp's "substance-free facilities" implementation has provided reason and funding sources to make improvements to the facility to elevate the experience of brothers living in the house. Total improvements this past summer amount to about \$68,000, including \$23K floor coverings, carpeting, demo, etc.; \$17K painting, non-routine cleaning; \$4k acoustical treatments, lighting; \$15K furniture/fixtures; \$9K year-end cleaning, painting, and trash.

Additional furnishings are intended to make a meal service offering possible and help utilize space in the house consistent with the substance-free facilities initiative.

Funds to complete the work this summer came from a variety of sources: the Chapter Investment Fund

(CIF) and Residential Learning Community Fund at SigEp Headquarters (CIF is contributed over time by the chapter, RLC fund is alumni donations), 2017-2018 and 2018-2019 operating budget for the facility, and the capital improvements fund, such as funds set aside regularly for improvements to the facility.

Additional recent improvement expenditures invested in the facility include upgrading the Wi-Fi networking infrastructure, upgrading the access control system, and replacing a hot water heater.

Roughly halfway into our 20-year mortgage, the outstanding balance on the note currently stands at \$485,740; down from \$810,000 10 years ago. Original bank financing obtained to build the facility was \$1,192,500; representing \$706,760 to date in total debt reduction since construction in 2004.

The AVC Housing Committee and our SENH partners, including Brant Smith, Dan McKenzie, Alex Hendee, and Ben Hutto, worked to complete as many improvements as possible. Thanks to their dedication and hard work, which resulted in the completion of this summer's projects!
