OH Eta raises \$11,446 for men's health

Last semester, SigEp organized a team of 28 brothers and friends who were eager to make an impact for men's health through the Movember Foundation – “the leading charity changing the face of men's health worldwide.” All told, the chapter raised an impressive \$11,446 during the month of November for the charity. The Movember Foundation has funded more than 1,250 men's health projects around the world transforming the way health services reach and support men. Three SigEp brothers: **Matthew Petraco '23, Hudson Curtin '24 and Jack Kohmann '24** were top fundraisers from the greater Cincinnati, Ohio, area.

SigEp's motivation for raising funds and awareness can be attributed to one of their chapter brothers, **Evan Crew '23**. Evan is a cancer survivor who is passionate about spreading awareness on the topic of men's health. According to Evan, “Taking part in something greater than yourself is always a gratifying feeling, especially

when dealing with a cause that has either affected you or those around you. The level of support received from the chapter brothers and friends is amazing! I don't think anyone could have expected the end result, but this illustrates who the brothers of SigEp are and what they stand for as a fraternity. It is truly special, and I consider myself lucky to be a part of this brotherhood.”

Dr. Steve Large, Miami's AVP of Health and Wellness for Student Life, provided the following perspective on the effort and outcome, “This entire effort perfectly demonstrates some of the special qualities and strengths of this chapter, specifically their deep commitment to each other, their generosity of resources and spirit, and their prioritization of holistic well-being.
